RULES AND REGULATIONS

ENTRIES CLOSE: Monday 4th December

All Entries and late Entries are to be electronic and entered into Main-Event.com

General Rules and Regulations for the governance and conduct of the Te Kauwhata A & P Show shall be the same as previously. If any exhibitor is not sure of the conditions they should get in touch with the Secretary.

Yellow Card - This Show/Event supports the RAS 'Yellow Card' system. A Yellow Card will be issued, In cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences.

Full wording of the 'Yellow Card' system is available to view on the RAS website – www.ras.org.nz.

Forbidden Substance - The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Forbidden Substances apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk. Forbidden Substance - Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, muscoskeletal or urogenital systems.

Arrears -No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other Show/Event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated Show/Event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.

Summary of RAS Resolution Process – the full process can be found on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz.

The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases it should be dealt with directly by the show. If the matter is in regards to an RAS official, the show may request the assistance of RAS Head Office as to how to deal with this in an appropriate manner.

Your entry or participation in the competition denotes acceptance of these conditions.

Entry Fees must accompany the forms otherwise the entries will not be accepted.

Administration Fees are added to your entry form, these cover Public Liability Insurance, Ground

Cover and Drug Levy to RAS, and postage.

R.A.S. Height Certificates are to be carried at all times and must be produced ringside if asked. Prize money may be withheld if not produced when asked.

The Association will not be responsible for any accident in competitions or that may occur from machinery or other exhibits or plants belonging to exhibitors, competitors or the Association and it is a condition of entry that such exhibitor, competitor or visitor shall hold the Association blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings issuing from any accidents so caused.

NO DOGS

Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazard created or accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the showgrounds.

Health and Saftey

Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate Animal Legislation and the Health & Safety at Work Act 2015.

All riders, including harness drivers, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area collecting rings or anywhere else within a Showgrounds. Hats/helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards and be tagged with the current recognised tag. These standards may be subject to change but the latest list can be found at http://www.ras.org.nz – equestrian.

RAS will advise any changes via their website and Facebook

No person is permitted in any judging ring without express permission from the Head Steward of that ring.

Only persons directly responsible for an exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.

Horses may enter only one Section - Park Hack, Hack, Riding Horse or Saddle Hunter. No classes will be held up for competitors competing in other rings, there are no exceptions. R.A.S. Height Certificates are to be carried at all times. Prize money may be withheld if not produced when asked.

A Newcomer horse or pony must have started the current season as a novice.

REFUND OF ENTRY FEES:

If a pony or horse is entered for the show but the animal or rider through injury is prevented from competing at the Show, and a Veterinary or Doctor's certificate confirming the fact is received at the Secretary's office by 10am on show day, 50% of the entry fees paid are refundable.

If the horse or pony competes at the Show or the respective certificates are not received within the specified time the right to receive a refund is forfeited.

ENTRY FEES & PRIZE MONEY:

Members of the Te Kauwhata A&P Association are entitled to a \$2 discount on each class entered.

You can pay for or renew a membership with your entry fees.

Te Kauwhata A&P reserve the right to exchange prize money for products when available. Prize money will be reduced to 1st and 2nd place if only 4 in class, 1st only if 3 in a class and the value of 2nd placing if 2 or less in the class. (until we can secure more sponsors). Where there are 5 or more entries in the class, then full prize money will be paid out.

LATE ENTRIES:

Late entries will be accepted up until 8.15 am on show day at a fee of standard entry fee plus 50%. TKShow is a 1 day show.

RAS Mid-Northern Youth, Steer and Heifer Competition

Background

RAS Youth Affairs & NZ Young Farmers have combined to develop this initiative to generate interest in livestock management and handling for youth of the Mid-Northern district for its second season
