#### RULES & REGULATIONS

1. **Entries close Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> March 2023.**
2. **Entry Fees are as stated at the beginning of each section in this schedule. All entries received online or by email must be paid in full by internet banking within 3 days of submitting entries to be considered entered. A \$5.00 Administration fee (per person) applies to all entries.**
3. All care will be taken but the society will not be held responsible for loss or damage or mis-delivery of exhibits at the show.
4. **Home Industries must be in the hall on Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> March 2023 before 1pm. Wool to be at the hall by 10am on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> March 2023. No late entries or exhibits will be accepted.**
5. No exhibit is to be removed from the grounds or hall before 3pm except by permission of the Committee. All items must be collected between 4pm and 5pm on the day of the show. Otherwise items will be donated to a charity unless prior arrangement has been made with Convenor.
6. Judging will start at the times stated in each section of this schedule.
7. Judges may not award a prize in any section where there is not sufficient merit. Their decision in all cases shall be final. Where there are only 2 entries, 1<sup>st</sup> prize may only be awarded. Champions will also be at the discretion of the Judge on the day, and their decisions will be final.
8. All entries in livestock sections shall be the bona fide property of the exhibitor. All produce and field roots must be grown and produced by the Exhibitors. All exhibits in the jams and preserves, baking, art and crafts sections must be the bona fide work of the Exhibitor.
9. **All horses and ponies to be ridden at walking pace except when being judged, or in designated areas.**
10. Horses and ponies for competition may be exercised in allocated arena only.
11. Stallions are permitted in all classes they are eligible for. Refer to CDE Rule 14 RAS Equestrian Competitors & Judges Rule Book.
12. All horses and ponies in Sporting Events to have back numbers.
13. The Committee reserves the right to substitute goods for cash as prizes in any section or class.
14. Admission to show – Donation Box on grounds, your support and donation is greatly appreciated.
15. The stewards in various classes are enjoined and empowered to prevent any persons from interfering with the judges during adjudication. No Exhibitor or other person (except judges, stewards and secretary) will be permitted to go inside the ring while the cattle and horses and ponies are being judged, unless where the stewards deem it necessary. No owner of stock shall go inside the ring while his stock is being judged unless said owner is actually in charge of the stock.
16. Protests: Protests in writing may be lodged with the secretary with a deposit of \$50.00, such deposit to be forfeited should the protest in the opinion of the Committee be not sustained. If lodged before judging has commenced the onus of proof will rest upon the Exhibitor; if after, the onus of disproof will rest upon the person protesting. The Committee shall have the power to refuse to entertain any protest or complaint lodged more than one hour after the conclusion of the event.
17. Late Entries: The Committee shall have the power to accept late entries and may charge a **\$30 late entry fee per entrant/horse** to be paid before the event starts. The Committee reserves the right to restrict the number of transfers in any horse or pony section. Any transfers in Sporting Events from one class to another will be allowed only on the duplication of the entry fees before the event starts. The Committee reserves the right to restrict the number of transfers in any horse or pony section.
18. Points will be awarded as follows for the horse section championships where required: 1<sup>st</sup> prize 5 points; 2<sup>nd</sup> prize 4 points; 3<sup>rd</sup> prize 3 points. Where there is only one Exhibitor, half the allocated points. Champion 1 point.
19. Home Industry point system and prize allocation procedure is available online at Main-events under the document tab

# Sheep

Entry fee - \$4.00

All sheep must be on the grounds, penned and ready for judging prior to 9am Sunday. No sheep to be in more than one class.

All ewes 2 shear or over in the opinion of the judge must have reared a lamb. No registered sheep eligible to be shown in the Flock or Prime sections. Sheep entered in the Purebred classes (14 - 21) do not have to be registered

COMPETITORS IN ALL EVENTS MUST WEAR AN APPROVED SAFETY HELMET WITH AN APPROVED TAG AS PER PONY CLUB AND RAS HELMET RULE.

Please Note: No 2-year-old horses or ponies to be ridden.

Registration numbers for Registered Welsh Exhibits must be included on entry form.

"Local" means both horse/pony and rider have been resident in the Strath Taieri ward of Dunedin City since 1st January 2023 (from Hindon to Hyde, Rock & Pillar Range to Taieri Ridge), or are financial members of the Strath Taieri Pony Club. To be local you must not have competed as a local at any other A and P show.

Championships eligible for Supreme Champion to be judged from height and led classes. First place-getters parade for Champion, the second place-getter to the Champion is invited to parade for Reserve Champion judging.

Novice means at time of show, open to horses/ponies that have yet to win 6 classes in any division within the competitions provided.

All horses and ponies to be ridden at walking pace except when being judged, or in designated areas.

Clean sport testing for forbidden substances may be carried out during the show.
