

# SOUTH ISLAND SHOW JUMPING SERIES

## 2024 2025

### South Island Horse Grand Prix – Mini Prix Series

#### Prizes:

1st – McCully Trophy, Dress Rug & Sash

2<sup>nd</sup> - 6<sup>th</sup> Sashes

#### Conditions

- The South Island Horse Grand Prix- Mini Prix Series is to be named:
  - “CURRENT SPONSOR” South Island Horse Grand Prix – Mini Prix Series.
- Points for this series to be gained by the HORSE & must be the same combination for the season.
- Shows to count: any carded shows run in the South Island.
- Classes to count: Horse Mini Prix (HMP), Grand Prix (HGP) or Premier League (PL).
- Points from only ONE of the above classes/ horse/ show to count, nomination is required at time of entry, if entering more than one of the above classes. If a rider fails to nominate a class, points from the higher height are to count. Placings below then move up.
- Points to count from up to a maximum of 12 rounds with lowest scores becoming drop scores (as per National series).
- Horse Mini Prix (HMP) is to be run at a height no lower than 1.35m.
- Riders gaining first round faults of 12 or more do not gain points.
- In the event of a tie, the highest place horse at the South Island Championships will determine the placing.
- Points allocation; 1st 2nd 3rd 4th 5th 6th
  - HPL - 30 25 20 15 10 7
  - HGP - 20 17 14 11 8 4
  - HMP - 10 8 6 4 2 1
- Points won by competitors or horses that are placed equal are added and divided equally.

### South Island Junior – Amateur Series

#### Prizes:

1st – Dress Rug & Sash

2<sup>nd</sup> - 6<sup>th</sup> Sashes

#### Conditions

- The Junior - Amateur class is to be named:
  - “CURRENT SPONSOR” South Island Junior – Amateur Series.
- Points for this series to be gained by the RIDER & does not need to be the same combination for the season.
- Riders will be eligible to take part in the South Island Junior- Amateur Series until the end of the season during which they reach the age of 21 years. The season begins on 1 August until 31 July the following year.

- Only horses are eligible to compete in the series.
- Shows to count: any carded shows run in the South Island.
- To be run in conjunction with the National Amateur Series class (1.10-1.20).
- Combinations may not compete in any other National series at the same show.
- Points to count from up to a maximum of 12 rounds with lowest scores becoming drop scores (as per National series).
- Riders gaining first round faults of 12 or more do not gain points.
- In the event of a tie, the highest place rider at the South Island Championships will determine the placing.
- Points allocation; 1st 2nd 3rd 4th 5th 6th
  - 10 8 6 4 2 1
- Points won by competitors that are placed equal are added and divided equally.

## South Island Pony Grand Prix Series

### Prizes:

1<sup>st</sup> - Jiminey Cricket Cup, Dress Rug & Sash

2<sup>nd</sup> - 6<sup>th</sup> - Sashes

### Conditions:

- Points for this series to be gained by the PONY & must be the same combination for the season.
- Shows to count: any carded shows run in the South Island.
- Classes to count: Pony Grand Prix (PGP), Pony Mini Prix (PMP)
- Points from only ONE of the above classes/ pony/ show to count, nomination is required at time of entry, if entering both classes.
- Points to count from up to a maximum of 12 rounds with lowest scores becoming drop scores (as per the National series).
- In the event that an area allows entry into more than one Championship class on the same pony, the rider must nominate which class is to count for points before the show commences otherwise points from the higher height will be counted.
- In the event of a tie, the highest place pony at the South Island Championships will determine the placing.
- Points allocation; 1st 2nd 3rd 4th 5th 6th
  - PGP - 30 25 20 15 10 7 (Premier shows -1.25 -1.35m)
  - PGP - 20 17 14 11 8 4 (Grand Prix shows -1.20 -1.30m)
  - PMP - 10 8 6 4 2 1
- Riders gaining first round faults of 12 or more do not gain points.
- Points won by competitors or ponies that are placed equal are added and divided equally.

## South Island Pony Mini Prix Series

### Prizes:

1<sup>st</sup> – Dress Rug and Sash

2<sup>nd</sup> - 6<sup>th</sup> - Sashes

### Conditions:

- The Mini Prix class is to be a Championship class and named:

- “CURRENT SPONSOR” South Island Pony Mini Prix Championship
- Pony Mini Prix (PMP) is to be run at a height no lower than 1.15m (Ideally 1.15 – 1.20m @ GP Shows & 1.15 – 1.25 at Premier shows)
- Points for this series to be gained by the PONY & must be the same combination for the season.
- Shows to count: any carded shows run in the South Island.
- Classes to count: Pony Mini Prix (PMP).
- Ponies gaining National Points in any PGP during the current season are no longer eligible for this series.
- Points to count from up to a maximum of 12 rounds with lowest scores becoming drop scores (as per the National series).
- In the event of a tie, the highest place pony at the South Island Championships will determine the placing.
- Points allocation; 1st - 6<sup>th</sup> - 10 8 6 4 2 1
- In the event that an area allows entry into more than one Championship class on the same pony, the rider must nominate which class is to count for points before the show commences otherwise points from the higher height will be counted.
- Riders gaining first round faults of 12 or more do not gain points.
- Points won by competitors or ponies that are placed equal are added and divided equally.

## South Island 1.10 Pony Points Prize Championship

### Prizes:

1st – Dress Rug & Sash

2<sup>nd</sup> - 6<sup>th</sup> - Sashes

### Conditions:

- This class is to be a Championship class and named:
  - “CURRENT SPONSOR” South Island 1.10 Pony Points Prize Championship
- This class is at 1.10m.
- It is based on the pony and not the combination.
- Ponies entered in this class are not eligible for the Grand Prix Pony class at the same show.
- In the event that an area allows entry into more than one Championship class on the same pony, the rider must nominate which class is to count for points before the show commences otherwise points from the higher height will be counted.
- Points to count from up to a maximum of 12 rounds with lowest scores becoming drop scores
  - (as per the National series).
- Ponies gaining points in any PMP or PGP during the current season are no longer eligible for this series.
- In the event of a tie, the highest place pony at the South Island Championships will determine the placing.
- Points: 1<sup>st</sup> - 6<sup>th</sup> – 10 8 6 4 2 1
