



9. Beef Steer R2

- Farm must sit within the range from Snapshot Creek, Haast to Totara River South, Ross.
- All cattle entered must have been grazed within this area for the entirety of their life.
- Entry Fee of \$25 must be paid by 25th January 2025. This entry fee will help cover the time of the judges who are coming from away, as well as supporting this section in future SWAP Shows.
- The complete line of cattle is to be presented separately and correct to the range stated. For dairy classes, there are to be between 25-30 head shown. For beef and dairy beef classes, you need to have 6-10 head.
- The complete line of heifers should be presented in a reasonably confide area (e.g. behind a wire) with reasonable access (handy to a road/ raceway). If R1's are not weaned, they can still be entered. Unweaned calves must however be separated from mothers in the yard. Mothers can be nearby, but not in the same pen.
- Judging committee will adhere to Health and Safety standards, and the recommendations placed by Ministry of Primary Industries for all on farm visits. All concerns of on farm disease or safety risk must be advised.

YARDS – There are a limited number of yards available, priority will be given to those travelling a distance out of the area. They are \$15.00 per night and must be left clean and tidy.

TRAVEL OVER 200KM – For those competitors travelling over 200km to attend the show they will be offered free yarding.

BACK NUMBERS - Number holders are encouraged to be used by all competitors using the appropriate number that the show issues. Those who require a back number, they will be available from the Horse Secretary. Numbers must be worn and visible in all classes.

MANURE/HAY – Please ensure all hay and manure is removed from float area and yards.

DO NOT GO BEYOND DESIGNATED EQUESTRIAN AREA -

Please stay off the rugby field and all parts of the golf course that are fenced off.

- All competitors and exhibitors ride and exhibit at their own risk.
- 2. Information re safety helmets.

- All ridden horses/ponies must be 3 years of age or over.

(1) NOVICE CLASSIFICATION

A Novice is a Horse or Pony which has not won 6 firsts in conformation classes at any A & P Show at the time of the Show (Ladies and Gentleman's Hack class wins count as an Open Conformation win and must be recorded). If a Novice entry has gained 6 wins by the day of the Show, the Competitor must advise the Horse Secretary's Office and may change to an Open class within the Sub-Section, or if no class remains to enter a refund which will be actioned after the Show. A Novice Hunter is a Horse or Pony which has not won 6 firsts in Round the Ring Hunter Jumping.


