Dairy Cattle Classes Rules **Judging starts at 10 am**

1. All dairy cattle two years and upward are to be visibly in milk.
2. All pedigree stock of twelve months to be eligible for stud book.
3. All pedigree and dairy cattle to be haltered.
4. Only stock from TB and Brucellosis Accredited herds which are not subject to Movement Control and have necessary TB Movement Cards may be exhibited.
5. The New Zealand Friesian Council passed a resolution allowing second and subsequent generations i.e. females prefixed by the letters SRB, SRC, SRD, Off Colour (OC) and Red Factor to be shown in the Pedigree Friesian section at shows.
6. Young Handlers animal must be a calf or yearling heifer of any registered dairy breed. The judge will be assessing the handlers capability, control and presentation, not the animal.
7. The following practices are banned from the Dairy Cattle section at all A&P Shows:
(a) the infusion of any drug to enhance the appearance of the animal (b) the infusion of a substance to the mammary system to alter the outward appearance of the udder or milk veins (c) the gluing, sealing or taping of teats or the use of artificial practices to affect the teat angle or teat placement.

TB Status of Show Cattle - That all cattle entered for showing which are 3 months of age and over must be accompanied by a signed and dated T.B. Declaration card. The animals must have either a T.B. Free or an accredited T.B. Free status, and in the case of breeding stock, be accredited Brucellosis Free.

T.B. Testing Requirements - Declared T.B. Movement Controlled Areas Cattle 3 months of age and over which are farmed or grazed within a Declared T.B. Movement controlled area must be negative to a T.B. Test within 60 days prior to the start date of the show. All Other Areas Cattle 12 months of age and over, farmed or grazed outside of the Declared T.B. Movement controlled areas, must be negative to a T.B. test within 12 days.

****Yellow Sticker Helmets to be worn in ridden classes & HOY classes to have height certificates**

RULES:

1. All Competitors ride at their own risk.
2. Local Boundaries: Rocky Cutting, Kairua, Pikowai, Rotorua County
3. All stallions and colts (with the exception of Miniature horses and foals) must be shown in a bit. All stallions and colts (except foals) to wear 2 official “S” badges and riders to wear 2 official armbands (purchase from RAS head office).

ENTRIES WILL BE RECEIVED ON THE DAY

RAS Rules - The use of tranquillisers, stimulants, or any drugs capable of affecting the performance of horses and ponies is forbidden. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing of all animals is at the owner's risk. Testing for forbidden substances will be carried out under the Royal Agricultural Society Clean Sport Judicial Committee procedures and rules (refer RAS Equestrian Judges & Competitors Rule Book). This Show supports the RAS Resolution Process Policy and a Yellow or Red Card will be offered for any inappropriate behaviour towards Show officials, Judges, fellow competitors or any other third party connected with the Show bringing the equestrian discipline into disrepute. Age of Riders is at 1 August 2023. Age of Ridden Exhibits –Exhibits three (3) years of age and under are not permitted in any ridden or driven (harness) class no matter what the rules of any affiliated Breed Society or Kindred Society may prescribe.

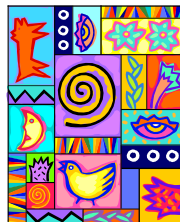
