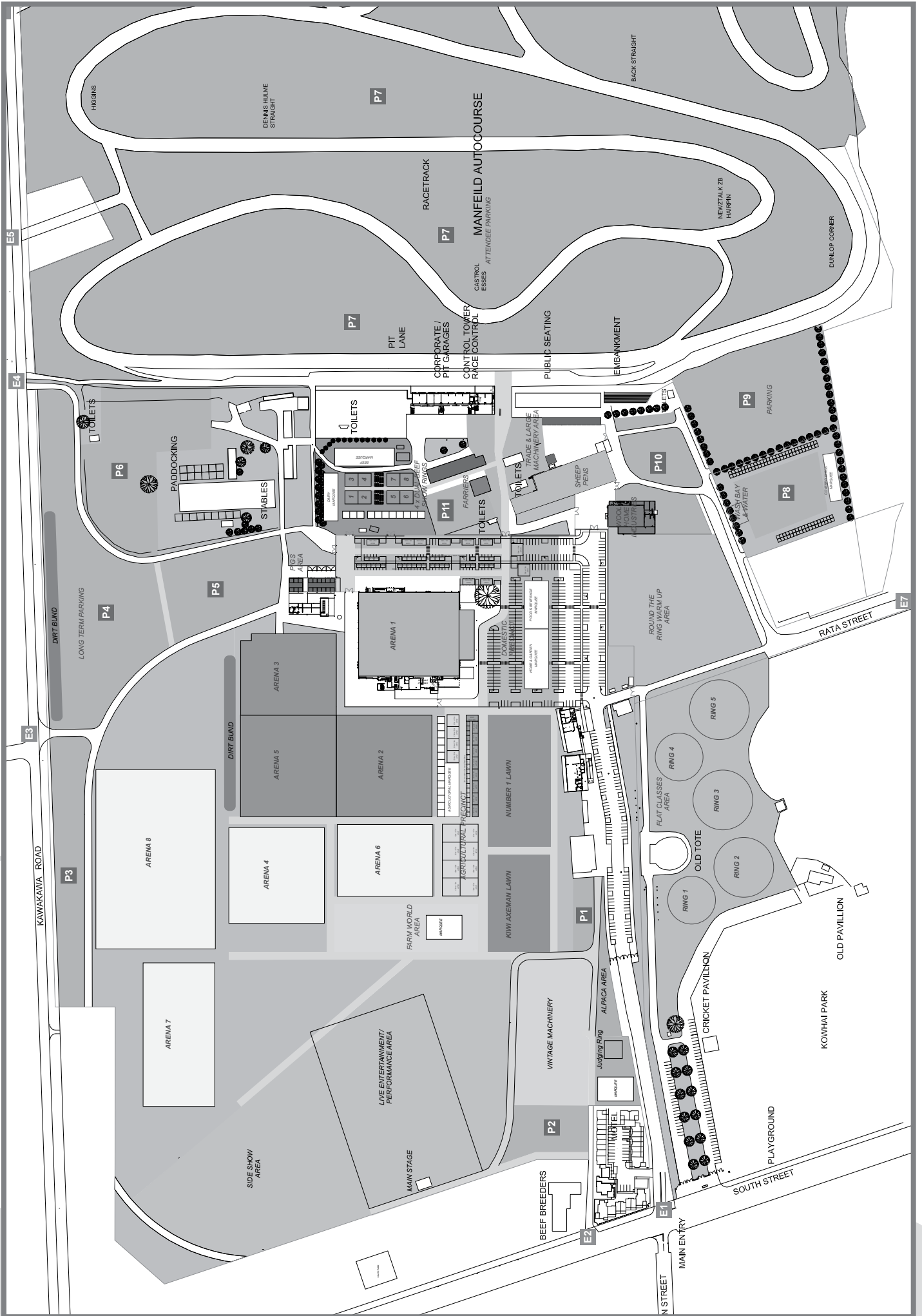

MANFELD PARK MAP INSTRUCTIONS

Please thoroughly read the instructions in your exhibitor pack to ensure that you do not encounter problems when entering Manfeild Park. Contained in this exhibitor pack will be parking passes and travel directions, which will be sent with your show tickets in mid-November. Please take the time to read the information below to familiarise yourself with the Manfeild Park venue layout, these instructions are for accessing Manfeild before, during and after the Royal Show.

ALPACA EXHIBITORS

Exhibitors will enter Manfeild for unloading and loading only via E2 entry gate off South Street between 6am and 8am each day. Once unloaded, vehicles should be parked in the area on the map shown as P2. The E2 gate will be locked during normal show hours. Entry outside of these times will be by arrangement with the Chief Steward only.

CLYDESDALE AND MOUNTED GAMES

Exhibitors will enter Manfeild via the E3 entry gate off Kawa Kawa Road. Parking for both sections is in parking area marked P3 on the adjoining plan. Exhibitors must be in and parked by 8am on each day.

FLAT CLASSES

Entry for all Flat Class exhibitors is via the E7 entry gate off Rata Street. Flat class yards and parking are also via the same entry in areas marked P8 and P9.

SHOWJUMPING

Entry for all exhibitors is via the E4 entry gate off Kawa Kawa Road. Long term truck parking is shown as P4 on the adjoining map. The area on the map shown as P6 around the stabling and yards is for showjumping exhibitors on Thursday, Friday and Saturday only. All

exhibitors must vacate stables and yards by Saturday evening unless prior arrangement has been made with the Stable Manager.

DONKEYS, MULES, HARNESS, PLEASURE AND MINIATURES

Entry for all exhibitors is via the E3 entry gate off Kawa Kawa Road. Day parking is available for you in the area marked P5 on the adjoining map. The area marked P6 is stabling and yards for these sections on Sunday only. All animals must be removed from the site by 6pm on Sunday.

BEEF AND DAIRY

Entry for all exhibitors is via the E4 entry gate off Kawa Kawa Road. The loading and unloading of animals is to be via the loading races located on the edge of the P5 parking area. All animals are to be settled on site by 8pm on Thursday.

SHEEP

Entry for all exhibitors is via the E7 entry gate off Rata Street. Loading races will be situated at the sheep pens for loading and unloading animals. The area marked P10 is for trucks and other vehicles associated with this section. Delivery of Spring Lambs is to be via entry gate E7 and all lambs must be penned by 8am.

SHEARING

Entry for all exhibitors is via the E4 entry gate off Kawa Kawa road. Parking for exhibitors is marked on the adjoining map as P5.

PIGS

Entry for exhibitors is via E3 entry gate off Kawa Kawa

road. Animals should be dropped off to their show area by 8am on each day and all vehicles removed and parked in the designated parking area marked P5 before the show opening times.

VINTAGE MACHINERY

Entry for loading and unloading of all vehicles is via entry gate E2 off South Street. Machinery must be delivered and in place ready for the show opening on Friday morning. All exhibitor vehicles must be parked in the area marked P2. The E2 gate will be locked during normal show hours, entry outside of these times will be by arrangement with the Chief Steward only.

FARRIERS

Entry for exhibitors will be via the E4 entry gate. Parking for horse trucks will be in P4, exhibitors parking will be in the area marked P11.

CAMPING

Exhibitors who have booked a camping site will be advised of the location of their site via the exhibitor pack being sent mid-November.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- For exhibitors arriving late to the show, there will be two late entry gates at E4 and E7. These gates will be manned by security and the correct passes will be required to gain entry.
- All animals are required to be removed off site by 6pm Sunday as there will be a fireworks display occurring later that evening.

CONDITIONS AND REGULATIONS FOR HORSE AND PONY SECTIONS

To be read in conjunction with the General Conditions of the "Royal A&P Show NZ" hosted by the Manawatu Consortium; and the Equestrian Rule Book and Guidelines.

Breastplate numbers in all Saddle classes, Arm Band numbers (available from the Horse Secretary) in all 'In Hand' and Working Hunter classes; and applicable ESNZ Identification numbers only are to be worn at this Show. Exhibitor number listing will be available on the Show website.

ENTRIES CLOSE FRIDAY 1st November 2013, except SHOW JUMPING / HUNTER ENTRIES which CLOSE FRIDAY 8th November 2013. However, Show Jumping/Hunter only, will be accepted up until 26th November with a 25% surcharge. ABSOLUTELY NO entries will be accepted after these dates.

HEALTH and SAFETY in EMPLOYMENT ACT 1992:

The Royal Agricultural Society and the Manawatu Show Consortium are required to conform to the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992. However, as a show Exhibitor at this venue you are also obligated to accept responsibility for ensuring a safe "Place of Employment" within the focus of this Act, which is to eliminate, isolate or minimize risk to personal health and safety. As a user of these facilities, you are required to take all practical measures to manage and supervise all your activities and exhibits to ensure the health and safety of all organizing representatives, agents, employees, servicing contractors and fellow competitors during the period of the show (including set-up and pack-down). Some obvious elements of potential hazard to note include: leading of livestock in public areas; use of machinery, tools and equipment; unstable platforms and ramps; riding of horses in public areas; areas not fenced; and please note that riders of motor bikes MUST wear a safety helmet, and no motor bikes are to be ridden after 8.30pm.

TIMETABLE: Exhibitors must know their class numbers and times by checking the timetable included in the Catalogue in case of class time changes and be ready to enter the ring before their start time. Classes missed are the exhibitor's responsibility. Late exhibitors will be excluded from the class. If the exhibitor is entered in multiple sections, the exhibitor must decide which class/section to compete in. No class or championship judging will be held up for delayed competitors. Please keep a check on the timetable on the web site in case of any changes due to entry numbers, or other unforeseen circumstances.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: A hard hat is generally described as a hunting cap, a bowler, protective headwear, or a safety helmet. Wearing a hard hat is compulsory for anyone competing on, working in or schooling or riding for any reason a horse at an A&P Show. It is strongly recommended that all riders, particularly those jumping horses wear protective headgear conforming to the current NZ Safety Standard or an equivalent standard and that the headgear be secured by a retention harness. No penalties will be incurred for those riders wishing to use approved safety helmets in showing classes. All pony riders under 17 years must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at three points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when mounted, at all times. In Turnout and Equitation Classes the rider has a choice to wear a three point Harness Safety Helmet. Riders opting to

wear a safety riding helmet (as described) in Equitation classes will be judged on 'equal terms' as a rider wearing the traditional bowler hat and lanyard.

AGE OF HORSES & PONIES is determined as from 1st August.

ENTRIES: All Showjumping and Showhunter entries to be made on the Official ESNZ Entry Form. All other entries to be made on the official entry form of the Manawatu Show Consortium, and must be completed and signed by the exhibitor, or person authorised on their behalf, and must reach the Secretary on or before the advertised closing date for entries. **Entries received after the closing date will be declined.**

For your entry to be considered valid (including on-line entries) the entry form must be completed and signed, all entry requirements must have been met, and ALL fees and levies must accompany the form. Your signature on the entry form is deemed to be your acceptance of the Rules and Regulations and By-Laws of the RAS, and the Conditions of the Manawatu Show Consortium, who reserve the right to refuse or cancel any entry without giving reasons for doing so. It is your responsibility to be conversant with the rules and regulations.

The Organising Committee reserves the right to alter conditions, or the order of events; or to cancel, split or combine classes or events, entirely at its own discretion.

OWNERSHIP & LEASES: RAS General Rule 36 - All entries must be made in the name of the bona fide owner of the exhibit, and such exhibits must have been the property of the Exhibitor at time of entry. A bona fide owner shall include a PARTNERSHIP or LEASE that has been registered with the Royal Agricultural society prior to closing of entries. A Lease must be for a term of not less than 6 months and shall commence on receipt of confirmation from the RAS that is has been received.

EQUESTRIAN LEVY: The Royal Agricultural Society of NZ charges a levy on each horse and pony entry at all A&P Shows, which is paid at time of entry (inclusive).

Alterations to Classes: Any class changes/scratchings etc during the Show must be made in writing to the Horse Secretary's Office by 4.00pm the day before the class(es). NO EXCEPTIONS, except Novice upgrading changes.

REFUNDS OF ENTRY FEES: The General Committee of the "Royal A&P Show NZ" hosted by the Manawatu Consortium reserves the right to refund entry fees at a rate of 75% upon submission of a) a receipted entry form, b) a veterinary or doctor's certificate, and c) a written explanation as to the reason for the request either before the show, or WITHIN SEVEN DAYS following the Show (no refunds will be considered after this period). The Association's decision shall be final. No refunds under \$20 will be made except where grading affects the class (this includes boxes and yards).

NOVICE CLASSES: Novice ponies may be ridden by a rider of any age in Novice classes only. **NB:** Horse/Pony height and performance cards must be carried at all times when competing, and be available at the request of a steward. Exhibitors failing to do so will forfeit all awards on the day.

All wins in Novice sections within each division (conformation, paced & mannered, rider) count and must be recorded on the RAS Performance Measuring card by the steward in the ring, and signed by the steward or judge.

Should a Novice horse win an open class, including Ladies and Gents classes, these wins must also be recorded. Once a horse has achieved 6 wins in either the conformation classes or paced and mannered

classes, this horse is not eligible to return to Novice status should it change Sections at the beginning of a new Show season - excludes Lead Rein & First Ridden.

Clarification: "not to have won 3 firsts (0-2 wins)", "not to have won 6 firsts (0-5 wins)".

Once a Horse/Pony/rider has had 6 wins it is not eligible for Novice Classes. Number of wins is to be counted at time of Show, not time of entry. If a Novice entry has gained 6 wins by the day of the Show, the competitor must advise the Secretary's office and may change to an Open class, or if no class remains to enter, a refund will be given after the Show.

Novice Champions are not eligible for Open Championships or the Supreme award unless they have won their Open Class. The Championship award does not count as a win.

UNRULY BEHAVIOUR by a horse or rider may result in the competitor being asked to leave the ring, and you **MUST** do so immediately. A yellow card may be issued if warranted, at the committee's discretion.

SUBSTITUTIONS: A Vet Certificate must be produced to the Secretary for any horse or pony being substituted. The substituted horse/pony must be owned by the exhibitor, and meet the criteria for the class(es) it competes in.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES: It is an offence for any electronic or audio equipment to be carried in the show ring, that is deemed capable of giving outside assistance to a competitor. Penalties may include forfeiting all prize money, awards and qualifications, and elimination from any further classes at that Show.

DISABLED EXHIBITORS requiring an aid for assistance during competition may apply to the Royal Agricultural Society for an identification card. RAS, PO Box 54, Woodend, telephone 03 313 1004.

FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCES: The use of tranquilisers, stimulants, or any substance which affects the performance of horses, ponies or riders is forbidden.

Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances will be carried out during the Show. Testing of all animals will be at the owner's risk and will be carried out under FSJC procedures (Refer Rule 89 RAS Equestrian Judges & Competitors Rule Book, and Rule 55A of the RAS By Laws and Regulations).

Your signature on the entry form, and/or participation in competition, denotes acceptance of these conditions.

JUDGING AND PRESENTATION OF EXHIBITS: Competitors must be ready for judging at the times stated, or they will be liable to disqualification.

No distinguishing mark of ownership or stud name, with the exception of registered brands, may be attached to the animal exhibited or the handler.

No competitor, exhibitor or member of their family shall approach a judge with regard to a decision unless they first obtain the permission of the Show Convenor/Chief Steward whom will make the decision on the day, and will be present at all times during discussion with the judge.

IN HAND HORSES & PONIES: (See also conditions at beginning of the In Hand section of the Schedule of classes). In Led Classes breeding must be shown on the Entry Form.

Stallions are not to be tied up unattended unless in an appropriate confinement. It is recommended that stallions be kept in stables or approved suitable yards.

SADDLE HORSES & PONIES: No horse or pony under 3 years of age is permitted to be shown under saddle.

In no case may horses or ponies be led or ridden outside the designated areas.

No change of rider will be allowed in any horse or pony classes after once entering the ring for that class, except in exceptional cases when consent of the Judge and the Chief Steward must be obtained.

A horse or pony being eligible for a Championship must be ridden by the same rider as in the class or classes in which it qualified unless the permission of the Chief Steward has been obtained. In the case of a rider qualifying more than one pony, a second rider must be found, and the Chief Steward informed.

The age of the rider is taken as at December 1st this year. Riders on open ponies are to be under 17 years of age.

Judges are directed to award prizes only to horses which they consider free from hereditary unsoundness.

In all Classes LATE COMERS will not be accepted into the ring for judging.

WORKING HUNTERS: In all Open Hunter jumping events one baulk will disqualify.

Hunters must be ready to start when called and must run in catalogue order, unless by permission of the Chief Steward.

SHOWJUMPING (ESNZ Competitions): To be eligible to compete, competitors and horses must be registered, and a current official ESNZ competitor form as well as horse registration stickers forwarded with entries. ESNZ Identification Numbers must be worn (See also Conditions in front of Showjumping section).

Showjumping entries close **Friday 8th November 2013**. HOWEVER entries will be accepted up until the 26th November with a 25% surcharge. Absolutely no entries will be received or taken after the 26th November 2013.

MEASURING: There will be no measuring during the Show.

Where height is a requirement of the Section, exhibitors must carry a current official RAS Life or Horse/Pony annual Height Certificate/Performance card.

Young stock, under 3 years, must have a RAS Young Stock Height Certificate dated no earlier than 1 August this year, where height is a requirement of the section.

All stock presented for measuring must be in a bridle or bit suitable for control. Please see measuring rules of the RAS. For bookings please phone John Wall Phone: 06 329 3746 Mobile: 0274 451 900 Email: jwwall@farmside.co.nz.

STABLING: Day parking is available for local exhibitors' trucks and cars with floats. Horses can be tied to floats in the designated parking area. **NB:** Yards are available, but no temporary yards are allowed to be erected. Applications for yards and boxes must be made at time of entry on the Horse accommodation form, which has all fees payable shown on it.

If a horse/pony is scratched the exhibitor **must** notify the stabling convenor so that the box can be reallocated.

Preference for boxes is given to Stallions, Colts, Brood Mares with Foals, Youngstock, and exhibitors from a distance. **DUE TO HIGH DEMAND PREFERENCE IS ALSO GIVEN ON DATE ORDER OF ENTRY AND BOX REQUEST RECEIVED I.E. ON A FIRST IN FIRST SERVED BASIS.**

Stallion boxes must have a sign denoting "STALLION" on the outside of the box.

The Organising Committee does not guarantee to provide horse accommodation as the number of boxes and yards are limited.

Exhibitors who are not allocated a box or yard may obtain a refund on application to the Horse Secretary's Office.

Boxes allocated to led stock must be vacated and left clean by 5.00pm on the first day so that they can be reallocated to Exhibitors in other classes. Wet and dirty bedding must be removed on vacating the box. It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to keep boxes and the area outside boxes clean and tidy.

Showers are available at the back of the Stadium.

SMOKING IN HORSEBOXES: Any person found smoking in or around the vicinity of the Horseboxes will be fined \$500.

AWARD OF CHAMPIONSHIPS: Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected as follows: First Prize winners in all eligible classes are to parade for the judging of Champion. All prize money will be paid at the Horse Secretary's office on presentation of your vouchers, which will be given to the place getters in the ring.

HORSE SECRETARY'S OFFICE: Please make any scratchings or class alterations during the Show directly to the Horse Secretary's Office.

DOGS are permitted on the Manfeild Showgrounds however they **MUST** to be under control at all times and if found not to be so they will be required to leave Manfeild Park.

THE RAS YELLOW CARD SYSTEM (as per remit at the 2010 RAS Annual Conference), will be submitted for any inappropriate behaviour towards show officials, judges, fellow competitors or any other third party connected with the Show, that brings the equestrian discipline into disrepute. All cases will be dealt with in accordance with the Conduct of members, owners, lessees, competitors and/or exhibitors as provided in the RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rulebook Rule 3, and rule 13 of the RAS Constitution.

PROTESTS: All protests must be received in writing by the Secretary of the Show within one hour of the event giving rise to the protest accompanied by a deposit of \$50 which may be refunded if the protest is upheld, at the discretion of the Show Dispute Committee.

CUPS AND TROPHIES: These will be available for presentation on the day and for photographs but are to be handed back to the stewards. They **ARE NOT** to be taken away from the grounds. The show will pay for the engraving of winners. (If you have any Manawatu A&P or Feilding IA&P trophies at home, please return them to our Manfeild offices asap, in a clean condition.)

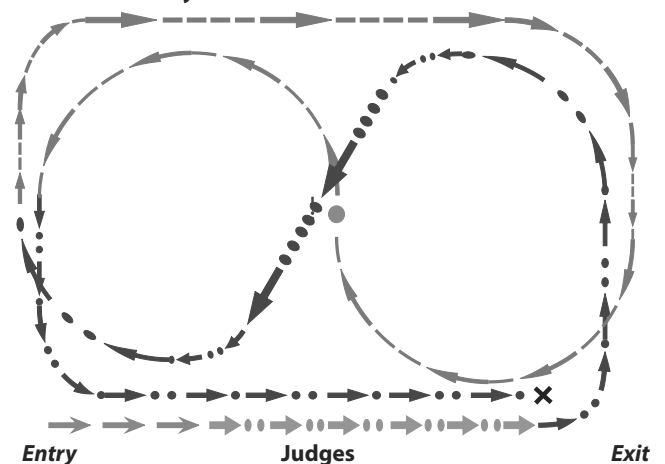

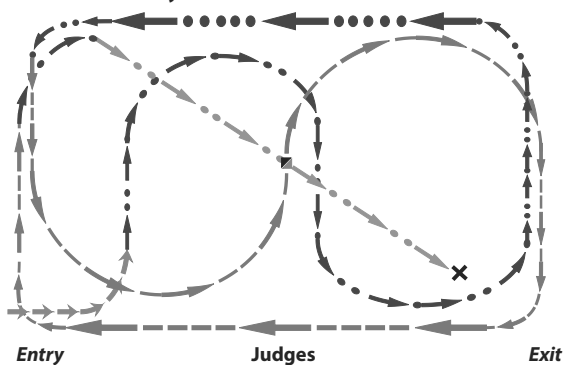

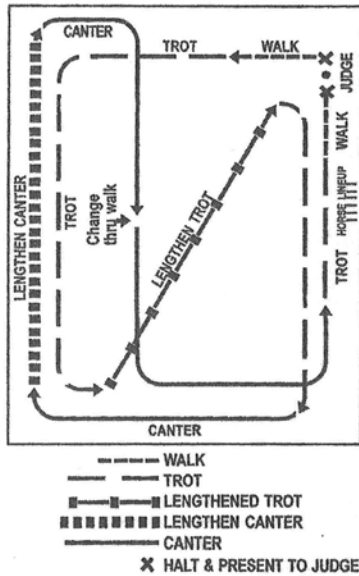

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands.

2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
