General Rules & Conditions

1. The Rules and Regulations as issued by the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand (Inc) for the governance and conduct of A & P Shows have been adopted by the Manawatu & West Coast A&P Association. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to be conversant with these rules. Copies of the Rules and Regulations are available on request.

The Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rule Book and amendments are available for purchase from the RAS Head Office.

- 2. Entries are accepted on the clear understanding that the Rules will be adhered to. (Please note Rule 51 re Hats and Safety Helmets, and the banning of electronic and audio equipment, 2009.)
- 3. A hard hat is generally described as a hunting cap, bowler, protective headwear, or a safety helmet. Wearing a hard hat is compulsory for anyone competing on, working in or schooling or riding for any reason a horse/pony at the show. Headgear conforming to the current NZ Safety standard or an equivalent standard, secured by a three point retention harness with the chin strap properly adjusted, and properly fastened at all times, is compulsory for all riders under 17 yrs.

4. Limitation on Entries

The Committee reserves the right to limit or refuse any entries. If any entry is refused, entry fees will be refunded in full.

5. FSJC Testing (Drugs)

The use of tranquillisers, stimulants or any drug which affects the performance of horses, ponies or riders is forbidden.

Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing of all animals is at the owner's risk. Testing will be carried out under the Royal Agricultural Society (Inc) Forbidden Substance Judiciary Committee (FSJC) procedures and rules. See Rules FS 1 to FS 8, RAS Equestrian Rules. The RAS forbidden substance levy has been included in the entry fees.

- Age of all horses shall be computed as at August 1st. Age of riders is as at the 1st January.
- All horses or ponies competing must be entered in the name of the bona fide owner or a member of his or her family, and all animals must be named at time of entry.
- 8. **Stallions** are eligible for all classes.

- 9. All leased horses or ponies competing at this Show must be registered with the Royal Agricultural Society. Such lease must be for a term of not less than 6 months starting from receipt of confirmation of the Lease from the RAS, and must be registered before entries are made.
- 10. All horses in classes of prescribed height must be measured, shoes or no shoes, and the person in charge must produce a current height certificate to the Ring Stewards, on request. 0.5 centimetres is allowed for standard shoes, racing plates not allowed.
- 11. Depending on entries, classes may be cancelled, split, or combined if appropriate.
- Brood Mares: Mare to have foal at foot or present veterinary certificate of pregnancy that includes a projected foaling date.
- 13. Before any prizes are awarded in Entire Classes, horses may be liable to examination by the Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the Association. The decision of the Veterinary Surgeon shall be final and binding on all parties, and shall not be questioned by any Court. The entry by any exhibitor in any of the classes affected will be deemed as acceptance of this clause.
- 14. Although it is provided that horses may compete in more than one class, any or all such classes may be judged simultaneously at the convenience of the Judges or Stewards. In all such cases exhibitors having an exhibit entered in more than one class MUST ELECT IN WHICH CLASS THEY COMPETE.
- 15 A horse or pony being eligible for a Championship must be ridden by the same rider as in the class or classes in which it qualified unless the permission of the Chief Steward has been obtained.
- When an owner has more than one pony/horse qualified for the same championship judging, a rider must be provided for each qualifier, and the chief steward advised.
- 17. **A Novice** is a Pony/Horse or Rider that has had up to <u>five</u> wins at any A & P Show, in any division at the day of the Show (Rule 65). After the sixth win, the pony/horse/rider is not eligible for Novice Classes. Novice ponies may be ridden by a rider of any age in Novice classes; and may also enter open classes, ridden by a rider under 17 years of age.
 - A novice champion may not compete in an Open Championship unless it has qualified through the open classes. The Height/Performance record card (now known as the RAS Certificate) <u>must</u> be presented on request in the ring, to be filled out and signed for each win. Winners failing to produce their card when requested will forfeit their awards on the day (Pg 47, & Rule 67).

18. The Manawatu A&P Association is required to conform to the **Health and Safety** in Employment Act 1992. However, as a show exhibitor at this venue you are also obligated to accept responsibility for ensuring a safe showing venue within the focus of this Act. As a user of these facilities, you are required to manage and supervise all your activities and exhibits to ensure the Health and Safety of all people involved in the show, at all times.

NB: Riders of motor bikes MUST wear a safety helmet, and no motor bikes are to be ridden after 8.30pm.

19. The RAS Yellow Card will be issued for any inappropriate behaviour towards show officials, judges, fellow competitors or other third party; or towards a horse/pony; that brings the equestrian discipline into disrepute. All cases will be dealt with in accordance with the Conduct of members, owners, lessees, competitors and/or exhibitors as provided in the RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rule Book.

20. NO TEMPORARY FENCING ALLOWED & ABSOLUTELY NO TAPE.

Covered and uncovered yards for Ponies and Horses are available on the grounds for the Show period, and must be booked on the entry form.

Dogs are allowed at Foxton Racecourse, <u>but must be under control at all times</u> <u>during the Show Weekend.</u>

There is a Ground Levy of \$5 per horse, and a First Aid Levy of \$5 per Rider/Handler.

These fees MUST accompany all entry fees

Horse Accommodation Charges

The yard fees of \$10 per night for outside yards, or \$20 per night for covered yards are payable and must be paid at the time of entry.

[For Friday night, pay to the Manawatu Showing Champs Show on their entry form; for the Saturday night, pay to the Manawatu A&P Show on their entry form].

Refunds of accommodation paid will not be made unless withdrawals are notified in writing prior to the commencement of the Show

Exhibitors must not occupy accommodation unless the allocation of same has been confirmed by the Horse Accommodation Steward or the Secretary.

<u>Please pick up dung and rubbish, and place in bins provided. Leave all yards, parking and camping areas clean and tidy.</u>

PARKING:

Horse trucks / vehicles may <u>NOT</u> park along the fence area in front of the Secretary's office between the Road Cones.

Access to the grounds is via Bergin Road only:

- Coming from North to Foxton, turn right into Victoria Street, (just past Main Racecourse gates), then right into Bergin Road. The automated entry gate is on the right.
- 2. Coming from South, travel through Foxton on SH 1to the northern end, turn left at Victoria Street, then right into Bergin Road, then right in the gate.

Prize Money and Entry Fees

** Entries received after the entry closing date will be declined **

Entry Fees include the RAS Forbidden Substance levy of \$1 per entry.

Entries can be made on line, or by post; but will not be deemed accepted until all fees have been paid.

All Prize Awards will be paid on the day of the Show (GST inclusive). **A prize voucher** will be presented in the ring to be redeemed from the Secretary's office on the day.

Prizes not claimed within one month of the Show will be deemed invalid.

Scratchings: A 70% refund of entry fees will be given if scratching is made at least 2 days before the beginning of the Show with a Vet Certificate or Medical Certificate. NO REFUNDS WILL BE PAID AT THE SHOW (Please do not ask).

PRIZE MONEY –Ribbons to all places, and **Full Prize Money** will be paid.

Additional Entries (for horses already entered in the Show) can be added after the Closing Date but will incur a 30% Surcharge.

Entry Changes on the day will incur a \$2 Fee

Other Arrangements

- BREAST PLATE NUMBER HOLDERS: Are compulsory for all showing classes except Working Hunters, Pleasure Horse/Pony classes, Donkeys/Mules and Miniatures.
- Competitors are responsible for providing their own number(s) black numbers on a white background only please.
- Working Hunter Riders, Pleasure Horse/Pony riders and Miniature handlers will be required to wear arm numbers on the left arm, which can be picked up from the horse office.
- > ARM NUMBERS: Any arm number issued and not returned will incur a charge of \$5.00. These are available at the Horse office.
- > Exhibitors must be neatly attired when entering judging rings with their horses.
- > INFORMAL TURNOUT in all Unit Classes, see pages 61-66 of the RAS Equestrian Rulebook and Guidelines.
- > UNITY CLASSES: Competitors will be judged together as a class with the following maximum points available.

- ➢ HEIGHT CERTIFICATE/PERFORMANCE CARDS (RAS Certificates) must be available <u>in the ring</u> at the request of a steward. Failure to produce them will result in forfeiture of all awards on the day.
- > Catalogues: There will be no catalogues printed, but entries will be on line before the show. Class lists may be displayed on the day.
- > HORSE of the YEAR SHOW QUALIFICATION CERTIFICATES: Please get these filled in and signed by the Show Convenor or the Secretary, on the day.
- For <u>all</u> horse enquiries during the Show please go to the secretary's office.
- > A Vet and Farrier will be On-Call. Contact details will be advised at the show.
- > Entry off Bergin Road **only**. The main gates off State Highway One will remain closed and locked.
- > There is no gate charge, or wristbands required this year.

Measuring Rules

The measuring rules of the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand will apply at this Show.

Life Certificates

- Life Certificates may be issued to open Horses/Ponies eight years old and over, or upon attaining the height of 168cm, providing they have been suitably branded or micro-chipped, under the rules laid down by the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand.
- 2. Life certificates will not be issued on Show Days.

Annual Certificates

- I. The age of horses/ponies is calculated as from 1st August.
- These certificates, which will be valid for 12 months from the 1st August, will be issued by an RAS Measuring Steward and his signature must be witnessed by an independent person.
- 3. RAS Certificates must record the horse/pony's age, sex, name, colour, markings, brand (if any), owner's name and address and date of measuring.
- 4. If normal shoes are fitted 0.5cm allowance shall be made.
- 5. A Young Stock Certificate will be issued for Horses/Ponies under the age of three years and will be valid as follows in any show:

1st August - 31st January 1st February - 31st July

- 6. The Horse/Pony to be measured shall be handled quietly and allowed a reasonable time to settle down.
- 7. The Horse/Pony shall stand squarely on all four legs, head in its natural relaxed position. The pole shall not be lower than the highest part of the wither.
- 8. The measurement shall be taken at the highest point of the wither.
- Miniature Horses are measured according to the rules of the RAS. This
 measurement is in centimeters and is taken at the last true hair of the mane.
 The conversion to imperial measurement is to be made using the form supplied
 by the NZMHA.
- 10. If the line on the movable part of the measuring machine is even slightly above the line on the set scale, the reading shall be taken to the nearest 0.5cm above.
- 11. If in the opinion of the Measuring Steward, the Horse/Pony has been improperly prepared for measuring, it shall not be measured.
- Annual Certificates, Young Stock Certificates and Life Certificates issued strictly in accordance with RAS Measuring Rules for Horses/Ponies, shall be accepted by all A & P Associations, Pony Clubs, Equestrian Sport NZ and other affiliated organizations.
- 13. Life, Young Stock or Annual Certificates which fail to comply with RAS measuring rules for Horses/Ponies are invalid.
- 14. Life Certificates may be submitted to the measuring Steward for alteration to metric equivalent in accordance with the table prepared by the RAS of NZ.


