Marlborough A & P Association Rules and Regulations

NOTE: These are to be read in conjunction with other rules and conditions outlined in their respective Sections and the Rules of the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ and their Affiliated Associations.

Any Exhibitor infringing any of the Regulations shall be subject to and be dealt with as may be decided upon by the Committee, or a Sub-Committee, whose decision shall be final.

1. ENTRIES ENTRY FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE.

- No Entries will be considered unless Entry Form (including online entry) has been completed.
- All entries must be made in the name of the bona fide owner of the exhibitor.
- Entry fees must be paid at the time of entry.
- No entry will be valid unless these conditions are complied with.

2 PRIZE MONEY

2a All prize money will be paid by direct credit as per your details or attached deposit slip, with acknowledgements emailed out after the show- following completion of an official Catalogue.

2b. Except those classes or competition which are sponsored by independent advertisers, and in those classes which are subject to age limits, prize money in any class shall not exceed the entry fee received by the Association. Where provision applies the available entry fee shall be paid out as two thirds first, one third second. *Does not apply in any sponsored events.*

2c. In the event of there being no competition in any class, half the first prize money will be paid, three entries or no second prize money, five entries or no third prize money in those classes where this is offered.

The Committee has the right to delete or combine any class or competition in the event of there not being sufficient entries.

- 3 Exhibitors will be required to state as accurately as possible, at time of entry, the date of birth of exhibit in classes where the age is specified.
- 4 No person shall have proprietorship for the time being in the pen which may have been allotted to the stock entered by such persons
- 5 No exhibitor will be permitted to put any placard or advertisement on the ground without the permission of the Committee or their representatives.
- 6 Supervisors shall have the power to instruct not to demonstrate.
- 7 No stock shall be permitted to leave the grounds before 4 pm on the Saturday of the Show without the permission of the Committee.
- 8 Any cow or ewe which is barren shall not be eligible to take a prize except in the fat stock classes.
- 9 All ewes over 18 months must be shown with lambs, unless otherwise specified.
- 10 All exhibits must be on the grounds by 8.30am each day (except where stated otherwise) Sheep which are not in pens by 9am will be disqualified from competition.
- 11 In Sheep Classes the pens will be numbered to correspond with the entry numbers of exhibits as stated in the catalogue.
- 12 The Committee will not under any circumstances hold themselves responsible for any damage or miss-delivery of stock or exhibits of any kind exhibited at the show.

- 13 Exhibitors and Attendants enter grounds at own risk.
- 14 All protests must be in writing and may be entered either before or after the Judges have proceeded to their duties. Any person entering a protest must deposit \$50 which will be refunded except if the protest held by the Committee to be frivolous. If any protest be lodged before the Judges proceed to their duties, the onus of disproof will rest with the exhibitor, if after that, that onus of proof will be with the person protesting. No protest will be received later than one hour after the prize tickets have been attached. The Committee is not less than five members thereof shall decide all protests as soon as possible, and there shall be no appeal from their decision.
- 15 All persons admitted into the Showgrounds shall be subject to the rules and orders of the Committee.
- 16 Exhibitors infringing any of the above Regulations shall be subject to and dealt with as may be decided by the committee or sub-committee which shall be final.
- 17 The value of points shall be First Prize 5, Second Prize 3, Third Prize 2, Commended 1. Stewards are instructed to place second and third tickets on all exhibits in Special Classes.
- 18 No Champion ticket or ribbon will be awarded in any section where in the opinion of the Judge not sufficient merit is shown.
- 19 In the event of there being only one entry in a cup or trophy class, no award to be made if the Judge does not consider the exhibit of sufficient merit, otherwise the Cup or Trophy to be awarded.
- 20 **GRAND PARADE:** All prize winners are requested to be present in the Grand Parade – failure to do so may result in the refunding of Prize Money, Sponsorship and Ribbons. No animal will be allowed to take part in the Grand Parade carrying an award or ribbon won at previous shows.
- 21 Judges are directed that stud animals having genital defects are to be disqualified.
- 22 Stock suspected of being affected with any infection foot complaint or lice shall be subject to an inspection by a stock inspector or a veterinary surgeon and should the stock be found to be infected it should be removed from the Showgrounds.
- 23 All Cattle to be registered as Pure Breeds with their own Society. All Cattle entered for showing must be from TB Clear Herd. Certificate of Status must be produced on demand. No beast may be entered into two difference age classes.
- 24 All Cattle will require the NAIT approved RFID tag. It is the livestock exhibitors responsibility to record all animal movements with NAIT 48 hours prior to leaving the farm/property for the Show and then within 48 hours of returning to the farm/property from the Show. **Marlborough A & P Association NAIT No. 455008**
- 25 AGRICULTURAL AND PASTORAL SOCIETIES ACT 1908: Should any Exhibitor in the opinion of the Committee, be guilty of any fraudulent or unfair practice, or any deceit or concealment, either in entering or exhibiting stock or any other exhibit, all exhibits of such an exhibitor shall be disqualified.
- Should an Exhibitor infringe any of these Rules and Regulations or refuse to comply with the direction of the Committee, the Committee shall have the power to suspend such a person as they may think fit. Should any person or firm be disqualified or suspended by a kindred Association, the Committee of the Association shall have the power to endorse such disqualification or suspension and disqualify and suspend such a person or firm accordingly.

- 26 The Marlborough A & P Association reserve the right to use all photographs taken on behalf of the Marlborough A & P Association without permission.
- 27 **YELLOW CARD** - This Show/Event supports the RAS 'Yellow Card' system. A Yellow Card will be issued, In cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences. Full wording of the 'Yellow Card' system is available to view on the RAS website – www.ras.org.nz.
- 28 **FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCE** - As per the RAS Rule
DRUGS or FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCE means any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage, conformation or conduct of an animal by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems.
59. The following practices are banned from the Dairy Cattle section of all A & P Shows:
- The administration of any drug to enhance the appearance of the animal.
 - The infusion of any substance to the mammary system to alter the outward appearance of the udder or milk veins.
 - The gluing, sealing or taping of teats.
 - The use of artificial practices to affect the udder shape, teat angle or teat placement.
60. From the time any animal enters the ground of any Show or event or competes in any class or event the Society or its duly appointed officer shall have the powers to order a drug test and if a test is ordered, the existing FSJC rules (suitably adapted in accordance with the type of animal being tested) and procedures and fines shall apply.
- MALPRACTICE (All animals except Dairy Cattle)**
61. Malpractice should be detected and dealt with by the Head Steward and/or the Judge at the time (i.e. the animal not placed), with the right for protests and objections to be dealt with as per rules 47 to 56
- 27 **ARREARS** - No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other show/event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated show/event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.
- 28 Summary of RAS Resolution Process – the full process can be found on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases it should be dealt with directly by the show. If the matter is in regard to an RAS official, the show may request the assistance of RAS Head Office as to how to deal with this in an appropriate manner.
