DANGERS		 Injury by falling, collisions with people falling, breaks, strains, sprains, cuts, unconsciousness. Lack of knowledge of preexisting medical conditions – asthma, diabetes, allergies. Dehydration, sun-stroke, hypothermia. Death by Accident – eg; major fall, being kicked or trampled by horses/ponies. Fire/Earthquake 	 Lack of safety equipment, riding boots and helmets. Riders MUST be wearing appropriate helmets at all times while mounted. All helmets must be red-tagged (as per NZPCA / ESNZ and RAS policies). The red tag is a visual confirmation that the helmet meets accepted Safety Standards in NZ. Riders will be checked at the gate. If they are wearing a helmet that is not tagged, they will be required to dismount and the helmet checked. If it is non-compliant the rider will 	unsafe. Weather conditions inappropriate. Give clear instructions of boundaries, behaviour and hazardous areas. Instructions on availability of obtaining water, ice, medical and veterinary attention. Adequate supervision of competitors whilst on Show grounds. Clear procedures on evacuation procedure. 	 Schools to provide their own, adequate first aid kit. Designated first aid officer and ice available. Equine Vet available in the event of an emergency. Walkie-Talkies supplied to key event personnel. 	1. Venue checked by event convenor. 2. Cancellation procedure established. 3. Ground entrance (Fleet Street) - Fleet Street will be the only gates unlocked. Please keep these gates closed at all times.
