RULES AND CONDITIONS

1. All riders 16 and under must wear safety approved headwear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than 2 points.
2. All persons enter the grounds and/or compete at their own risk. Horsewyse, while exercising care, will not be responsible for any loss or damage to stock, property or vehicles. Each competitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazard created, or accident, illness or damage caused by their action of themselves or their animals at the racecourse. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate animal legislation and the health and safety in employment act of 1992.
3. A rider may only enter a rider class if competing in other classes in that ring
4. Dogs are allowed at Foxton racecourse but must be under control at all times.
5. Any persons found guilty of abusing an animal will be asked to leave the grounds immediately.
6. No whip shall exceed 76cm in ridden competition.
7. A horse/pony may only be entered into one section with the exception of lead rein/first ridden.
8. Protests must be lodged with the secretary and in writing and accompanied with a \$20.00 fee within 10 minutes of the event.
9. Simple snaffle, bitless bridle or hackamore are allowed in the pleasure ring.
10. Exhibitors may be transferred to another ring at the judges discretion. This decision is final.
11. The show is run under RAS rules with some exceptions in the pleasure rings.
12. The programme may be changed at the organisers discretion. We reserve the right to refuse any entry without assigning a reason. Any person who has been red-carded, officially warned or banned from any show will not be allowed entry for a period of one year from the offence.
13. Novice horse and ponies may be ridden by riders of any age.
14. Open ponies must be ridden by riders under 17 years of age.
15. Show pony leading rein riders must be aged 4 years and under 8 years and mounted on ponies 128cm and under. The lead must be attached to the cavesson on a simple snaffle bridle.
16. First year ridden riders must be under 10 years of age and mounted on ponies 138cm and under.
17. In the pleasure ring only adults may ride ponies and riders under 17 can be on horses. The junior pleasure riders must be under 10 years of age.
18. Stallions are not permitted in ridden events as per RAS Rules
19. Start times are approximate and may change due to entries.
20. Novice performance card must be carried during competition
21. All trophies are perpetual, engraving is the responsibility of the winner, trophy held for 1 year
22. Novice exhibits may also enter their respective Open classes. One blanket fee is payable per animal with exception of rule 7.

DEFINITIONS:

PLEASURE MOUNTS: are those animals which do not fit the criteria for a show horse/pony. This may be due to colour, conformation, breed or aging. Although they will not have the beauty queen style of a show animal they will in their own right be a pleasure to own and ride. Animals competing may be any colour or breed. They must **not** have won in the open show ring at an A&P show (excluding the pleasure section). If the exhibit is of show type it belongs in the show section, even if it is inexperienced for it is still a show animal.

RIDING HORSES: are those animals who do not fit the criteria of the hack, park hack or hunter sections, but still shows quality in conformation.

SHOW HORSE/PONIES: are therefore elegant, well mannered and free moving horses, being sound in wind and limb. They should be well presented and give the appearance of quality.

CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS SECTIONS:

This section honours the exhibits who have been crowned Champion or Reserve champions in the previous year. Qualification is by winning one Championship Or 2 reserve champion ribbons at any ridden show since February 10th 2009 up to and including this years event. (you can qualify on the day)

The animals are required to perform an individual workout and points will be awarded:

Show exhibits: conformation 50, paces and manners 30 and general appearance 20

Pleasure exhibits: conformation 40, paces and manners 40 and general appearance 20

The judges are changed from morning to afternoon classes. (with possible exceptions in the pleasure section)

ENTRY FEE \$10 per mount.

BRUCE CHARLES CLARKE MEMORIAL TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP:

This is a new event for the show and is proudly sponsored by Anita Roberts (nee Clarke) to honour her late father, Bruce Charles Clarke.

Teams consist of three different riders on three different mounts. Teams may comprise one pony and two horses or 2 ponies and one horse. They may compete in any section and the best 5 scores per mount (excluding any 'special' awards) will count toward the team total, plus any open championships. This ensures a level playing field for all teams. Sashes to 5th place and medals to 3rd place.

Points: Champion 5 points Reserve champion 3 points

First 10points, second 7 points, third 5 points, fourth 3 points

The points will be collated during the morning classes and the result will be given before the lunch break.

Entry \$15 per team, or individual riders can pay \$5 to be allocated into a team selected at random.

THE BOB LINTON CHAMPION RIDER OF THE SHOW:

This event is in memory of Bob Linton and is proudly sponsored by Megan Hawkins (nee Linton).

Every rider who wins their rider class (excluding lead rein, first year ridden and junior pleasure) is eligible to enter. Riders are worked individually and the rider scoring the highest points is the winner. Sashes to 6th

THE ALANA CLAPPERTON CHAMPION JUNIOR RIDER OF THE SHOW:

This is a new event for 2010 and honours the achievements of Alana Clapperton. The rider class winners in the junior pleasure, lead rein and first ridden are all eligible. An individual workout will be set and the rider scoring the highest points will be the winner. Sashes to 6th.

THE QUALITY PRESENTATIONS SPORTSMANSHIP SASH:

This award is made to a rider who exemplifies the very best in gracious sportsmanlike behaviour and shows a sense of camaraderie with their fellow competitors. The decision is made by all judges on the day.

THE ASCOT SASH: These sashes are awarded to the winners of each of the Smartest on Parade classes

Open to all exhibits who have won one champion or two reserves in ridden competition since 10.2.09 up to and including 14.2.2010. Exhibits must have competed in the morning classes.

Open to all show pony exhibits (excluding lead rein and first ridden) who have won one champion or two reserves in ridden competition since 10.2.09 up to and including 14.2.2010. Exhibits must have competed in the morning classes.

THE HORSEWYSE CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS JUNIOR SHOW PONY

Open to all lead rein and first ridden ponies who have won one champion or two reserves in ridden competition since 10.2.09 up to and including 14.2.2010. Exhibits must have competed in the morning classes.

The Horsewyse Champion of Champions trophy, Victory sash, Screen printed Dress Rug and \$100.00 Horsewyse voucher. (and bragging rights for one year!)
