Emergency - Dial 111 Notify teacher in charge who will liaise with the schools Jeanette Summers: 0275434532

- In the event of serious injury Code 1 will care for the patient until an ambulance arrives on scene.
- Bystanders will be asked for statements.
- If the injury is on the XC the competitors will all be stopped and brought in from the course.
- If the injury is on the SJ or in the parking lot crowds will be moved from the scene and a cordon put in place.

- I am a current Intermediate or Secondary School Student.
- I understand there are no veterinary or farrier services are on site today and only low-level first aid services are present.
- I understand the inherent risks of equestrian activities, in particular riding over XC fences and that these risks cannot ever be eliminated.
- I understand that the rules around horse welfare, abuse of the horse and dangerous riding apply to this Inter School Event as well as Registered Competitions.
- I respect that members of the Organising Committee overseeing this Inter School Event have the right to ask me to stop/leave the premises.
- I will remove my horses manure and any rubbish/hay before leaving.
- I understand the committee reserves the right to limit numbers, cancel or change a class.
- I understand competitors must provide a telephone number for emergency contact.
- I understand riders who are eliminated in the cross country phase CANNOT continue the cross country course and must walk back to the start keeping out of the way - this applies to all classes.
- I understand all schools must provide a phone number for a named jump judge per 4 riders- this is a condition of entry.
- I understand no dogs are allowed. The relevant rider may be eliminated if this is ignored.
- I understand no vehicles are allowed on the Cross Country course except officials & Cross Country Fence Judges.
- I understand all vehicles with horses must park in the designated float/truck area.
- I understand no rubbish or manure collection service is available at QE Park. I will take away ALL my rubbish and clean the twine, manure and hay from around my float or truck and in my yard and take it away with me.
- Scratchings will be accepted up to 48 hours prior to the event. Riders can apply for an 80% refund of entry fee—this must be done in writing to equestrian@kc.school.nz accompanied by vet and/or doctors notes.
- I understand that in the event of cancellation due to government restrictions an 80% refund will be processed.

Conditions of entry:

Competitor or Exhibitor must comply with the appropriate Legislation and the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992. Each Competitor and/or exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazard created, accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves at the venue of the Event.
