We kick off with a couple of our traditional training days in May and June, and then are excited to host a Winter Series Competition that provides a fun, safe but stimulating environment for horses & riders, and encourages a competitive, yet learning series - celebrating development and success!

Sunday 30 May	SJ Training Day	\$30 per horse (incl levy) - up to 3 x rounds Starts with a crossrail class no more than 50 cm and increases in 10 cm increments
Sunday 13 June	SJ Training Day	\$30 per horse (incl levy) - up to 3 x rounds Starts with a crossrail class no more than 50 cm and increases in 10 cm increments
Sunday 4 July	Winter Series Day One	With Show Jumping gear and focus

## Format

- Horses and ponies compete in the same height class. Riders must select “Hack” or “Pony” as they enter, and will ride in draw order. Prizes will be awarded for top placed hacks and top placed ponies per class; series points will be allocated to ponies and hacks separately.
- Series points are accumulated from **one nominated class** each day. This can be nominated after a practice round, but before any competition. If no nomination is made, the first competition class completed will be counted.
- You may enter the same height / class twice, however only your **first round** will count towards a prize or points.
- Entries are taken online only

### Show Jumping focus competition days:

- First class is a “Cross Bar” challenge. All clear rounds win
- Classes 50-60 cm, 60-70 cm, 80 cm, 90 cm, 1 m, 1.10m, 1.15-1.25m
- Horses may enter up to 3 x classes per day (only one counts towards points)

### Show Hunter focus competition days:

- Practice rounds at height 40-max of 50 cm (one round per horse). Enter online.
- Classes 60 cm, 70 cm, 70 cm pony equitation, 80 cm hack equitation 80 cm, 90 cm, and 1m
- Horses may enter up to 3 x classes and complete one practice round per day

### Series Points Allocation

Points will be allocated separately for Hacks and Ponies in each class (not practice rounds) held on competition days, as follows:

*(Eliminations, retirements or greater than 12 faults will not gain points regardless of class numbers.)*

Series points will be accumulated against the horse/rider combination.

Horses ridden by a different rider during the series will be recorded separately, eg:

No points or prizes will be issued for practice rounds.

## Series Prizes

Jumping Wairarapa reserves the right to alter points allocation in unforeseen circumstances (such as an event called off half way through) and to refuse entries where they are deemed inappropriate or unsafe. Judges decisions are final.

## Winter Jumping guidelines & Information:

- ★ Only organisers (and nominated assistants) are to be in the ring during rounds
- ★ Coaches or parents **may not** enter the ring for the purpose of interacting with a rider. Assisting a fallen rider, video recording or pole picking is encouraged!
- ★ If you have 3 x stops at a height you can not come back at a bigger height. You are able to repeat the height you were at should you wish
- ★ Riders who fall must be checked
- ★ Organisers will suggest a veterinary consultation if they feel a horse is uneven
- ★ Where possible, please assist the organisers pack up for the day. They're tired volunteers - your help is truly appreciated
- ★ Ponies and hacks will run in the same class, but will be grouped so that the distances can be altered accordingly (eg all ponies, then change double for hacks)
- ★ Run in draw order
- ★ Dress is tidy (and warm!) casual
- ★ The sand arena is to be a smoke free area please
- ★ Solway Showgrounds require dogs to be on a leash at all times

- ★ All manure is to be collected and placed in the designated areas. This includes yards, around your float/truck, and on the sand warmup and jumping arenas
- ★ No baby prams in the warm up area, please. We recommend using the adjacent paddocks where your child is better protected in the event of a startled horse
- ★ Please be mindful of where you congregate - leave the areas around the gate and warm up fences clear for competing riders please. Please don't be offended if we ask you to move to ensure a safe and fair warm up area
- ★ Spot prizes may be awarded
- ★ Entries cancelled with more than 24 hours notice will be refunded in full. Those cancelled after that will be receive a 50% refund
- ★ Entries may be altered on the day if necessary, but must be made in advance through main-events please

### Types of Classes:

- **A1 (1 round, not against the clock)**  
In a Table A1 class, competitors with equal jump penalties share equal placings. Placings are not determined by the time taken to complete the round. Eg all clear rounds are first equal. (Article 238.1.1)
- **A2 (1 round against the clock)**  
In a Table A2 class, competitors with equal penalties for any place are positioned in accordance with the time taken to complete the round. The competitor with the least faults and the fastest time wins. (Article 238.2.1)
- **AM5 (A Jump Off class against the clock)**  
In an AM5 class, the first round is times, however if there are competitors tied for first place after the first round (with equal jump faults) a jump-off will be carried out. The jump-off is also timed. The winner will be the competitor with the least faults and the fastest time in the jump-off. Those who jumped off fill the top placings based on faults and time in the jump-off. The rest of the placings are filled by the competitors who had the next least jump faults, and based on their time in the first round.
- **Show Hunter Equitation**  
Jumped over a show hunter type course that may have more technical questions and with some added tests. Halting on course, jumping a fence from a trot, or performing a sitting trot are just some of the tests riders may be required to do. The required *course workout* will be published at the start of the competition day and needs to be memorised prior to the competition.
