RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Bay of Islands Show will be conducted under the Rules and Regulations of the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ (RAS). A copy of these rules can be viewed on the RAS website: www.ras.org.nz. All persons admitted to the Showgrounds shall be subjected to these Rules and Regulations.

The Bay of Islands P & I Association is an affiliated A & P Show of the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand (Inc) and as such the rules of the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand (Inc) for Forbidden Substances will apply at the Show.

The use of tranquilisers, stimulants or any drug capable of affecting the performance of horses or ponies is forbidden.

Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show. The testing of all animals is at the owners' risk and will be carried out under CS procedures (RAS Clean Sport Rules). Maximum Monetary Penalty under RAS Rules is a fine not exceeding \$10,000 – see Equestrian Rule CS5. Maximum Monetary Penalty under NZER Rules is \$15,000.

Health & Safety

- 1. The Association will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage that may be caused to or suffered by an exhibit or which may be caused directly or indirectly by any other exhibit; notwithstanding any alleged negligence on the part of any Officer or Servant of the Association; and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Association indemnified against any claim in respect of any claim in respect of any such accident, loss or damage caused by any exhibit of such exhibitors. By signing the entry form declaration, exhibitors accept the Association's conditions of entry and indemnify the Association under the provisions of Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and any amendments.
- Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accidents, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals on the Showgrounds. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate animal legislation and the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and any amendments.
- The Association reserves the right to order immediate removal from the Showgrounds of any animal it considers unruly or unmanageable.
- 4. It is the Association's policy to see that all reasonably due care is taken to protect property and to protect and to keep in efficient order its own property and to make provision for the protection of the property of others. The Association shall not be liable to any person in case of loss or damage by reason of any defect, accident, negligence or neglect howsoever arising.
- 5. Persons occupying grandstands, buildings, other structures or seating accommodation on the Showgrounds do so at their own risk, and no claim shall be made against the Association in respect of any loss, or injury by reason of any defect of accident, or by reason of any act or omission whether negligent or otherwise, on the part of the Association or of any employee or agent of the Association or on the part of any other person.
- Parking is entirely at the owners' risk. Any vehicles parked will be on this condition and the Association accepts no responsibility for any loss, theft, injury or damage attributed to any negligence on the part of the Association, its employees or stewards.

General Show Policy Rule

The purpose of the Bay of Islands Pastoral & Industrial Show is to provide the community and visiting competitors, the opportunity to have an enjoyable day of fun and friendly competition.

The Bay of Islands Pastoral & Industrial Association has therefore made a policy rule that any person or persons who verbally, or otherwise, abuses fellow Competitors, Stewards, Judges or Show Officials will be asked to leave the Showgrounds and their offending actions will be referred to other Districts A & P Shows.

Entry Submission

Equestrian, Calf Club and Young Farmer entries are to be submitted via Main Events.

Entry Dates

Entries open on 1 October 2021 and close Friday 22 October 2021.

Pet Lamb ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED ON SHOW DAY and will not incur a late entry fee.

Late Entries Policy

Late entries will be accepted until **5pm**, **Friday 5 November 2021**. ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED ON SHOW DAY.

All Late entries will also attract a late entry fee of fifty (50) percent of the entry fee for each class entered late, in addition to the normal entry fees. Late entries will not be catalogued.

Entry Fees Refund

An 80% refund of entry fees will be paid to any competitor who has to withdraw from competition on presentation of a Doctor's or Veterinarian's Certificate or at the discretion of the Show Committee.

Entries received after the closing date will not be catalogued.

Show Cancellation

In the event of the cancellation of the Show, refunds will be made as follows:

- 80% of Competitors' Entry Fees
- 80% of Trade Exhibitors' Site Fees

Grand Parade

All prize winners in the Equestrian & Livestock Sections are required to parade their winning animals/exhibits in the Grand Parade on Saturday 13 November 2021. Any prize winner not complying shall be liable to have their prize money forfeited, at the discretion of the Executive.

EQUESTRIAN CLASSES

The following Rules & Guidelines apply to all Horses, Ponies and Riders in the Equestrian Section.
The RAS Equestrian Rules for RAS affiliated Shows/Events, Competitors, Exhibitors and Judges (see www.ras.org.nz) sets out all the conditions that apply to the classes and sections offered.

Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate animal Legislation and the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and any amendments thereafter.

All riders must wear an approved safety helmet ('red' tagged) & suitable footwear at all times.

Entrants in all classes must provide a photocopy of a current Height Certificate with entry fees and must carry the original certificate while competing.

At the direction of the Royal Agriculture Society of NZ, there will be no penning behind tapes or rope of horses or ponies at any time while on the Showgrounds.

The use of tranquilizers, stimulants or any drug capable of affecting the performance of horses or ponies is forbidden.

Competitors are advised that Clean Sport Testing for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show. The testing of all animals is at the owner's risk and will be carried out under CS procedures.

All horses to be brought into the ring under the direction of the ring steward.

All horses & ponies competing in any event must be entered in the name of the bonafide owner or a member of his or her family.

No stallion shall be eligible to enter.

No refunds will be given without a Vet's or Doctor's certificate.

Any rider or horses competing in the Horse Rings are not eligible to compete in the Pony Rings. Rider and Horse to compete in one ring only.

Novice Classification: all horses that have not won more than five (5) firsts in classes judged on conformation. Open Classification: all horses that have won six (6) or more classes. Only Novice horses may enter in Novice classes. All may enter in open classes.

A current Height Certificate must be produced before any ribbons are presented or prize money is paid out.

The Committee has the right to alter or combine Classes depending on entries.

Prizemoney will be awarded: 4 or more entries in class – Full prizemoney, 3 or less entries in class – First place prizemoney only, 1 entry in class – Ribbon only. Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the Showgrounds. No person is permitted in any judging ring without the express permission of the Chief Steward of that ring.

Only persons directly responsible for an exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.

All Horses and Ponies are to be ridden with a bit attached to the bridle. Bitless bridles are not permitted for use in in the BOI A&P Show Ring. If used on a horse or pony, this will result in disqualification.

The use of Prefixes on Horses & Ponies in the Showing Classes at RAS affiliated Shows be those of the Breeder only.

The Society reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without adducing any reason for doing so.

Number breastplates are now compulsory. Black on white or white on black, except for jumping classes where bridle numbers may be used. All horses must wear a number.

Equestrian Entries are to be submitted via the Main Events website and will close on FRIDAY 22 OCTOBER 2021.

Late Entries will be accepted until 5pm on Friday 5 November 2021.

All Late entries will attract a late entry fee of fifty (50) percent of the entry fee for each class entered late, in addition to the normal entry fees.

Late entries will not be catalogued.

No Equestrian Section entries will be accepted on Show Day.

Horse pens are available and must be booked and paid for with entry – you will need to supply your own gateways.

Please clean your yards after use.

Horses/Ponies must be kept in allocated yards.

NO TEMPORARY PENS (tape, rope, chain etc.).

Show Entry wristbands are compulsory for all riders/ handlers/exhibitors/spectators (12 years & under FREE). Wristbands must be pre-purchased with Equestrian entries & will be posted before the Show.

Wristbands to be worn at all times.

Catalogues available to download from website.
Winners of all Equestrian classes are required to attend the Grand Parade on Saturday 13
November 2021.



The aim of this competition is to encourage young people to enhance their skills on animal handling and knowledge whilst fostering showmanship between competitors as well as having an opportunity to bridge the gap between calf club and the pedigree ring.

- This competition is run in the Northern District only and the overall top four placings will be selected from participants who live within the Northern District RAS region.
- Competitors in the Junior competition are to be 5-12 (inclusive), whilst competitors in the Senior competition are to be aged 13-19 (inclusive) All ages are as of October 1st of the current show season. Competitors may be asked for proof of age on show day.
- Entry is to be free to all competitors.
- In both the dairy and beef competitions, junior competitors may only enter a calf and senior competitors may enter either a calf or yearling only.
- The competitor may only enter the beef or dairy class, not both. Any competitor recorded competing in both the dairy and beef section will be excluded from the overall competition.
- To be eligible for the overall Northern Districts Young Parader prize, the competitor must compete in four or more Northern District A&P Shows in the particular class for the current show season. Please refer to the RAS website for a full list of Northern Districts A&P Shows.
- The competitor may enter as many shows as they wish, however their final score will be calculated as an average from their top four shows.

- The highest scoring Northern District competitors in each
 of the four classes will receive \$100 for 1st place, \$75 for
 2nd place, \$50 for 3rd place and \$25 for 4th place,
 sponsored by the Northern District RAS.
- Judged are to line-up all competitors. Shows are to record the names of all entrants regardless of placing.
- Results will be published on the Northern Districts RAS
 Youth Facebook page shortly after each show in order to
 track the competition. Please contact this page directly

Judging Guidelines

Presentation of the competitor

- The competitor is to wear a plain white shirt with dark pants and clean, strong, appropriate boots for cattle handling. No open footwear or gumboots are permitted;
- No logos or advertising whatsoever are permitted. This includes on hats and breed uniforms.

Presentation of the animal

- The conformation of the animal itself is not to be judged, however general presentation is to be taken into consideration. It is expected that the competitor has prepared the animal sufficiently themselves and is encouraged to know basic information about the animal such as birth date, breeding and rearing.
- Rope, leather, chain and nylon halters are permitted. It should be clean and fit the animal correctly.
- For beef competitors if a show stick or cane is carried it is to be used correctly.

Parading of the animal

- The competitor should aim to display the animal in such a manner that the judge gains a clear view of the animal at all times, and that the animal is seen to the best of its ability.
- Emphasis is placed on the effort of the competitor to be able to parade and handle in general regardless of the particular animal on the end of the halter, therefore senior competitors will be requested to swap animals (juniors will not).
- The competitor should be able to stop, move the animal on and keep the animal under control whilst being aware of where the judge is in the ring.
- Outside assistance is not permitted under any circumstances and competitors will be disqualified.

It is the responsibility of the show to brief the cattle judge fully, prior to this class with its specific rules and it is strongly recommended that this class is judged straight after lunch whilst animals, competitors and judges are fresh. The decision of the Northern District RAS Youth Representative is final.




