HORSE ACCOMMODATION:

All yards will be allocated on a first in first served basis when you place your entries/prebook.
\$15.00 - Wooden Open Yards only

Any horses in the wrong yards will be impounded by the committee, these horses can be collected upon payment of a \$50.00 cash impound fee. \$50.00 cleaning fee applies to any stables or yards not cleaned out.

COVID-19: Please read the rules regarding COVID and be familiar with the COVID response plan in place.

BY ENTERING THE GROUNDS YOU ARE AGREEING TO THE FOLLOWING:

- I have read and understood the Covid 19 plan
- I will comply with social distancing & face covering guidelines while on the grounds.
- I have not had any Covid 19 symptoms in the last 14 days, I am also not waiting on Covid 19 test results.

GATE ACCESS:

Entry to the Grounds is through gate 1 only. You will be require to scan into the Grounds for contact tracing at this point. Please take note of the arrival times and when the gates will be open below:

Friday 29th October – Gates open from 4pm to 7pm. Please note that the gates will be locked and there will no entry on or off the Grounds from this time. Please park in the camping area only.

Saturday 30th October – Gates will be unlocked at 6.30am. Day competitors please park in the day parking area only.

NO RIDING ON COMPETITION SURFACES unless competing. Ring orientation is available at 7.30am – 8am on Saturday 30th October. All rings must be clear by 8am.

CUPS/TROPHIES: All cups/trophies will be retained and engraved by Wairarapa A & P Society.

Trophies will be available for photos and can be collected from the main office and returned after you have taken your photos etc, you will need to know the name of the trophy when collecting.

\$10.00 Ground Levy

\$5.00 Judges and Stewards Levy

CATALOG: There will be no printed catalogues. An online version will also be available on main events

ENTRIES CLOSE ON 25TH OCTOBER 2021
No entries will be accepted after 25th October.

No email entries will be accepted.

Payment must accompany entries, any entries received but not paid by the closing date will be considered late.

Entries will be accepted via the Main Events website. The correct names and registration numbers of all horses, ponies and riders must be stated on the entry form.

Exhibitors must read the rules of RAS and check their entry form carefully.

Entry in this show confirms that you have read and accept the rules under which our event is run.

Entry in the Show entitles the Society to publish an Exhibitors name in results and distribute with Exhibitor Lists.

The Society reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without giving a reason for doing so

The Society reserves the right to cancel sections and classes if there are insufficient entries.

SWAP/SCRATCH/ADD (CLASS/HORSE):

Late entry fees will not apply to swapped classes when the swap out of/into classes are nominated at the same time.

Class swaps entries must be received by the secretary by 6pm the day prior to the class including those sent via email.

Class swaps must be on the appropriate form completed in the office or by email with complete information (horse name, rider name, class change required) any balance resulting will be followed up after the event.

This only applies to horses and riders already entered in the show, no new horses or riders can be entered after 25th October.

REFUNDS FOR SCRATCHING:

100% refund of entry including levies and yards if horse secretary is advised before 6pm on the 25th October 2021

50% refund of entry including levies and yards if horse secretary is advised before 6pm on the 29th October 2021 with a vet or doctors certificate for the horse or rider entered.

NOVICE:

A Novice horse or pony or rider is one that has yet to win 6 show classes in any division within the competitions provided at an A & P Show. Upon achieving the sixth win in a division, a pony, horse or rider thereafter must compete in the appropriate open classes within that division. i.e. not to have won three firsts - (0-2 wins) not to have won six firsts - (0-5 wins)

Once a horse/pony/rider has three wins they are no longer eligible and can only go in the 0-5 wins class, once they have six wins they can no longer enter in a novice class in that section.

Exhibitors must carry a current performance card for every Novice horse and make this available in the ring upon request. These must be signed by the Exhibitor or some person authorised to sign on their behalf and must be received before the closing date set.

STALLIONS :

Stallions competing must wear official stallion badges at all times and handlers/riders must wear approved armbands.

There are no Stallion stables/yards available on the grounds.

HUNTER CLASSES:

Are open to all horses not entered in Hack, Park Hack or Riding Horse sections. Hack, Park Hack and Riding Horse sections are open to horses not entered in the hunter section. Exhibits in harness and hack classes can also compete in the driving, jumping and hunter classes where eligible.

CHAMPIONSHIP:

A horse/pony being eligible for championships must be ridden by the same rider as in the class or classes in which it qualified unless permission of the Horse Marshall and stewards has been obtained.

MEASURING/HEIGHT CERTIFICATES:

No measuring available at this Show. Measuring will be available prior to the Show. Details can be found on Wairarapa A&P's facebook page or contact the A&P office on 3798124.

Exhibitors in any class with a prescribed height or where a Certificate of Height is required will be asked to show this certificate at any time. They may not leave the ring to obtain a certificate and will forfeit awards if certificate is not shown. Measuring Rules of The Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand will apply at this show.

No measuring available at this Show.

PERFORMANCE CARDS:

Valid performance cards **MUST** be carried **AT ALL TIMES**, and produced on request of a steward, or the rider will be disqualified from competing (i.e. prize money & ribbons will be forfeited, with no refund of entry fee).

PROTESTS:

Any protests must be lodged with the Horse Marshall within half an hour of results being posted, accompanied with a \$50 fee; to be forfeited if the complaint is not upheld.

All disputes will be settled by the judiciary committee consisting of the society's executive and marshal of the section.

CLEAN SPORT:

The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Forbidden Substances apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk. Forbidden Substance - Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardiovascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems.

ARREARS:

No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other Show/Event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated Show/Event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted. Lists of amounts owing at 8th November will be sent to RAS, ESNZ and secretaries of future events.

RAS YELLOW CARD SYSTEM:

This Show/Event supports the RAS 'Yellow Card' system. A Yellow Card will be issued, In cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences. Full wording of the 'Yellow Card' system is available to view on the RAS website – www.ras.org.nz.

AGE OF RIDERS OR HORSES:

Riders age and eligibility is determined as per the 1st of August. I.e. Riders/handlers who are of age for any division/section on 1st August complete the show year/season in that division/section.

Riders in horse rings (exhibits over 148cm) must be 12 years & over.

The age of the horse/pony is calculated as from the 1st August per ESNZ series rules

SADDLERY & ACCESSORIES:

Whips in ridden classes shall not exceed 76 centimetres in length.

Whips in lead rein and first ridden sections shall not exceed 68cm including the flap which shall measure no more than 2cm wide and 4cm long.

Whips in lead classes shall not exceed 145cm

Saddlecloths are optional however it is preferred that saddlecloths used and are at least are cut to the shape of the saddle.

Bearing reins, running reins or similar tack may not be used.

The misuse of a whip or spurs, or the committing of an act of cruelty by an exhibitor to his horse or pony within the limits of the showground, including rapping or misuse of a practice jump will be penalised.

Any such act must be reported by any horse/pony steward or judge to the Judicial or General committee.

In the interest of safety, the stirrup iron & the stirrup leather (this also applies to safety stirrups), must hang freely from the bar of the saddle and the outside of the flap. The rider must not directly or indirectly tie any part of their body to the saddlery, unless an exhibitor's disability card is held.

HATS & SAFETY HELMETS:

Wearing a hard hat is compulsory for anyone competing on, working in, or schooling or riding a horse/pony in any area considered to be part of the showground.

All riders must wear protective headgear with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within the showground.

Helmets must meet the required safety standards as of 1 August 2017. Red tag must be visible on helmet harness.

Helmet Tagging will be available at the show, please contact horse secretary to arrange prior to the show.

SAFETY:

Each Exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the Show grounds.

Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate Animal Legislation and the Health and Safety in Work Act 2015; and any amendments thereafter. All competitors compete at their own risk.

The Society reserves the right to refuse any competitor's entries without giving a reason.

MOTORBIKES/SCOOTERS:

May be ridden within grounds by licensed holders and not after 10pm. Helmets must be worn and there be no passengers.

DOGS:

Dogs are welcome at our show however they must be kept on leads and supervised at all times, any wandering or unsupervised dogs will be handed over to Carterton City Council Dog Control at the dog owners expense. No warnings will be issued.

MEDIA:

By entering or attending the Wairarapa A&P Show you accept that you may appear within differing media streams that are on location covering the event.

Your behaviour at the event and within the competition arena is at your discretion and is your responsibility.

Please note that there might be live streaming at the event therefore the camera is on throughout the day, there may also be several photographers on the grounds.

By entering the grounds you give permission for your photo to be taken and provided on their respective websites/facebook pages at the discretion of the photographer.

PRIZE MONEY PAYOUT POLICY

Due to COVID and the uncertainty of Alert Level amendments, there will be no Prize Money. The entry fee as been amended to reflect this. All classes have an entry fee of \$8.

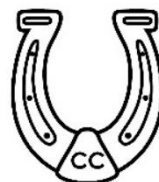
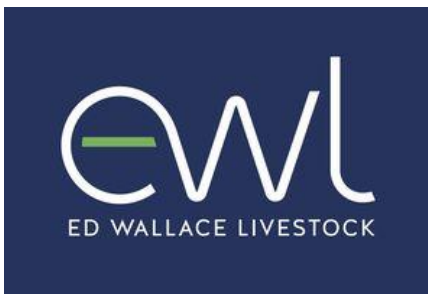
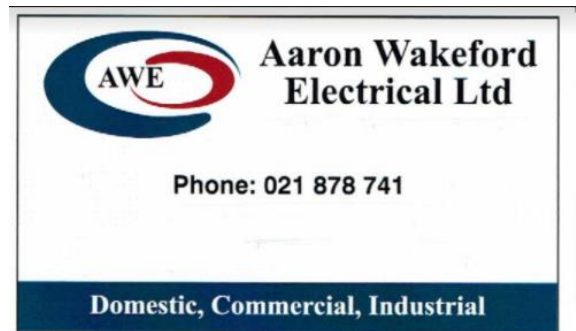

COVID RULES

This show is being run under the COVID Level 2 Event rules. Please read this carefully.

OBLIGATIONS UNDER COVID -19 PROTOCOLS

What you need to know

Alert level 2 is not life as normal. Please ensure you

- Keep your distance from other people in public
- Wash your hands
- Sneeze and cough into your elbow
- Keep a track of where you have been and who you have seen
- Wear a mask at all times on grounds
- Do not come to the event if you are feeling unwell

Physical distancing

Physical distancing of at least 2 metres needs to be maintained on site at all times.

Signage will be put up to remind people of this.

Entry - Sign in – Mandatory Contract Tracing

We will have one entrance to our event with a QR code available to scan (and will also have manual contact tracing register on hand for those unable to sign in using the QR code). In addition, all personnel attending the event will need to pre-register their details or record these on entry. All competitors will have agreed to these regulations prior to entering. The gate will be manned at all times.

Toilets

Bathrooms will have signage providing guidance from the Ministry of Health on how to wash hands properly to prevent the spread of viruses. Toilets will be thoroughly cleaned between the morning and afternoon events. Soap and water will be available as well as hand-sanitiser.

Face coverings

The government has mandated the use of facial masks at level 2 to help to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

- You are encouraged to wear a face covering when you cannot maintain your physical distance from others. If you can not socially distance in any parking zone, please wear a face covering.
- **Face coverings MUST be worn when you are in a competition area or warm up zone** when you are not mounted on a horse. This means all those assisting a rider must wear a mask.
- Face coverings should be worn when visiting the secretary's office and toilets.
- Face coverings are not required when exercising or playing sport. In an equestrian context face coverings must be worn where physical distancing of 2 metres is not possible.

Riders please ensure you maintain social distancing when you are mounted and following the instructions of your steward at all times.

Requirements of entering this Show

By entering this show you confirm the following:

- I have read and understood the Alert Level 2 Response Plan
- I will comply with social distancing while attending the Show
- I will wear a mask when required
- No one in my vehicle has had any COVID-19 symptoms in the past 14 days and I do not require to be in isolation for any reason
- I will provide all contact tracing requirements.

PERSONAL AND SITE HYGIENE

1. The use of standard rubbish/disposal bins are provided for used PPE, paper towels/tissues, and any other related items. These bins will be provided with plastic liners that can be safely removed.
2. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands.
3. Cough or sneeze into a paper towel/tissue or your elbow to prevent potential spread of COVID-19. Any used paper towels/tissues are to be placed in the designated COVID-19 item disposal bin immediately after use.
4. Maintain a high level of personal cleanliness throughout the day. Wash and dry hands with soap after using the toilet

and before handling food. Sanitising should be completed as a secondary line of defence to hand washing.

5. Cleaning and disinfecting of high use surfaces and objects will occur regularly. This includes door handles, light switches, toilets, gates, hosing bays. Use disposable PPE (gloves and mask) when cleaning down surfaces with disposable cloths/paper towels to clean surfaces. These disposable items are to be placed in the designated COVID-19 item disposal bin immediately, which can then be tied and placed in the skip bin on site.

6. Avoid physical contact with others at all times.

7. The Pony Club rooms are off limits to everyone except officials.

VOLUNTEERS/ COMMITTEE MEMBERS:

We cannot thank the people who are helping us be able to run this event this year such as stewards, judges, gate people and other helpers. We will not tolerate any abusive language towards these people, we understand it is not an easy situation to be in but if we can all oblige by the rules and regulations and do what we are all asked to do it should be a great show.

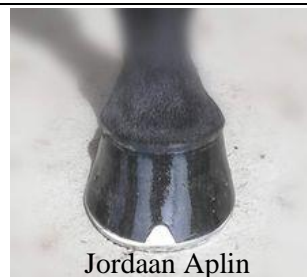
