Please note that after a course walk today, the TD's have asked the Organising Committee to change the order of the 65 cm Cross Country from Saturday to Sunday, and Show Jumping from Sunday to Saturday for safety reasons with the light.

Welcome

Thank you to everyone who has entered our Two Day Event this weekend. We are really excited to able to run a schedule from 65 to 110 classes and we are delighted this has been so well supported from riders. If it's your first-time riding at NEC Taupo or a seasoned NEC regular, welcome to you and your supporters - we look forward to sharing a great weekend of eventing with you. You are on the "Rode 2 Champs!"

To make sure you know what's going on, here are some riders' notes which we would appreciate you taking the time to read over especially if you are new to eventing or usually do ESNZ eventing as there are some quirks to NZPCA eventing you may not remember.

Your event is running in conjunction with the NZPCA Eventing Championships. In total there are over 250 riders, please be patient and understanding of the logistics.

The Eventing Champs functions are all private, sorry.

Article 614 PARTICIPATION: athletes entered in an NZPCA Events must be a member on the NZPCA database or a casual membership <u>must</u> be completed prior to the start of the competition. - The on site vet is Dr Keelin MacDonald, Waikato Equine Vets, Taupo 027 253 6985
- The on site farrier is Paul Nelson 027 444 0207. Please pay him at the time for his services.
- Transit Care paramedics are on site all weekend.

The office is in a massive portacom surrounded by flowers by the Indoor Arena Car Park. This is where to go for queries, merchandise, back numbers etc.

Please bring your own back number holder, or safety pins to pin your paper number to your top.

Please have identification tags on horses at all times as per ESNZ rules.

We will have food trucks and coffee on site both days (sat & sun). Located by the Indoor.

We have tradestands in and about the Indoor Arena.

Riders Breakfast:

Fiber-Fresh are putting on a free Riders Breakfast from 8-9am outside the indoor arena. There will be tasty morsels for your horses too! So come and have a chat about your horses nutrition, while you indulge in yours, and grab a

snack for your favourite pony. Big thanks to Shannon Galloway and her team from Fiber-Fresh for this amazing occasion.

Parking:

Please park considerately so we can fit everyone in. Please park closely as there are no horses to be tied to trucks or floats in the main showground - all horses must be in yards. Please put up tents in front of your vehicles not besides them so we can squeeze everyone in where they need to be. Sorry, there are no powered spots available.

Gear:

Gear checks are COMPULSORY for all classes 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, & 15 (65 and 80cm) and before XC for classes 4, 5 6 and 7 (95cm). The 105 and 110 rider can be spot checked. Failure to be gear checked will result in elimination. You can't miss the gear checkers – they wear fluoro vests with Gear Check on the back and are sited by a gazebo by the office with a sign saying Gear Check. If in doubt, present to be checked. Allow extra time to get to your class on time in case there is a queue of people ahead of you.

- Helmets must be red or yellow tagged.
- Gloves must be worn for dressage.
- Approved back protectors must be worn for the cross country phase. These will be checked at gear check. They must be made from 2009 and have the correct EN number on the label.
- Hair must be tied up and not obscuring the riders back number.
- Horse ID tag on headcollar is COMPULSORY at ALL times in yard or hand grazing (rider or parent name and cell number). Name tags must be present on the saddlery when mounted.
- Back numbers must be worn when mounted at all times, even if not competing.
- No whips are allowed in dressage for classes

Yards and other need to know

Yards are allocated by Rider name. On arrival please only put your horse in its allocated yard. We are really tight on yards and if people use a yard not assigned to them this creates a problem for the next person and so on. If on arrival there is an issue or someone is in your yard, please come to the Portacom office and we will sort it. If your yard gets damaged over the weekend, please let the office know. There were only limited covered yards available and they were allocated on a first in basis. Refunds will be sent out after the weekend.

Dressage

Callers are allowed for classes 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14 and 15 (65cm and 80cm).

Arenas start at 8am - there are 8 arenas.

Cross Country

XC will start at 11am with 110, 105, 95, 80 and 65 running on in back number order. We will aim to run at 2-1.30min intervals and to keep as close to back number order by class. 105, 95, 80n and 65 Riders as per the ESNZ eventing rule a rider can take the option of missing a jump and will incur 100 Penalties.

There are Options at some fences, and there are Black Flag jumps. Please also note that the Champs courses are different to the Two Day Event courses, so make sure you know which track to ride and which markers to follow. If in doubt – ASK!! All the officials will have a lanyard, and a bright green hat on – but maybe not!

Show Jumping

For all classes you will be jumping in either Arena 2 or 3. Show jumping will be back order.

Ribbons & rosettes for dressage and overall place winners to 6th place will be available 45 minutes after the end of the class. Overall class winners are expected to present mounted for their Rug Presentation for sponsors photos, and all others in show attire.

- Yards have been allocated and your yard numbers have been emailed to you. Please remove all dung to the muck heaps provided.
- There were only a few covered yards available and they were allocated by entry order. Refunds will be processed after the Show.
- Health and safety plan will be available on the entry gates, and is attached at the end of this document.
- XC course will be open for walking from 9am Friday.
- The 65cm show jumping course will be open for walking 30 minutes before the class start. The other show jumping courses are available to walk on Sunday from 7.30am.
- No competitor motorbikes on the grounds.
- Food and trade stands will be available.

- All falls must be checked by the medics. We have paramedics and an ambulance on site
- If you fall off on the cross country, you will have to walk your horse off the course
